Vehicle Does All But Talk

Guns move in and out, license plates flip and doors open by remote control on the Green Hornet's Black Beauty, super-designed car which is being displayed at the 1967 Motorama Show.

Originally a 1966 Chrysler Crown Imperial four-door, the Black Beauty is 21 feet from nose to tail and weighs about 800 pounds lighter than a stock Chrysler.

Dean Jeffries who designed and built the car has come up with a point-by-point description of the car's special features.

The complete front end was removed, he said, and a completely custom nose shell and all aluminum grille was made, along with special headlights. One set of dual Ranger high-powered roadlights was installed on each side. A flip of the switch and two lights turn on, with a special set of green-ray lights following. These lights work by an electrical screw gear and 12 volt motor.

Below the lights are two 10 by 18 inch panels that open by electric motor and cover 10 rockets on each side.

A 15-inch gun is located just below the center section of the grille. Press a button and the gas gun comes out, shooting real fire and gas.

Special steel bars are located at the front and rear of the two sides. These bars also have electric motors for control . . . the bars are used for front rams, bumper or special brackets for clamps which hook onto another car (to flip it or jack it up).

Special hand made park and turn signal lights (two inches tall by seven inches long) were installed.

All chrome molding was removed and the holes filled. The front wheel openings were reworked and special Appliance Apache aluminum wheels were installed, along with specially made Goodyear tires.

On each side of the rear window is a "gun" door, four inches by seven inches, that opens from within. Another gun is located in the center of rear end, behind a small round door that resembles a gas tank.

The license plate is electrically controlled . . . it can be turned to another plate with the flick of a switch.

In the center of the decklid is a remotely-controlled closed circuit television or radar camera.

Behind the two rear tires are two hidden brooms. Flip a switch, the brooms lower, and remove all tracks that the car might leave.

The interior of the car is upholstered in black leather and black satin dyed goat skin.

Between the front and rear seat is a special glass window. Below the glass and to the right is a hidden clothes closet. This closet is 24" wide x 3' tall. When the door is closed you cannot tell a closet is there.

Also, in the closet door is a special 10" x 8" intercom and T.V. closed circuit unit. This is also very well hidden. In the center of the panel below

the glass, is another hidden panel.


Behind this 12" x 10" door is a radar screen and control screen used to fire the rockets, fire front and rear guns, or control special camera that comes out of center of rear decklid.

To the left of this screen is a special panel that is 2 1/2' long and 8" tall and 6" deep. On the panel are all the switches and buttons and

dials that make all the guns, rockets, lights, brooms, etc. work. Inside of the right door panel a hidden panel opens and inside it is over 30 switches and lights that are used for various operations of the car.

There is over 2,000 feet of wiring in this car and over 40 special electrical motors. Autolite Co. made a special battery for the power to operate all the motors.

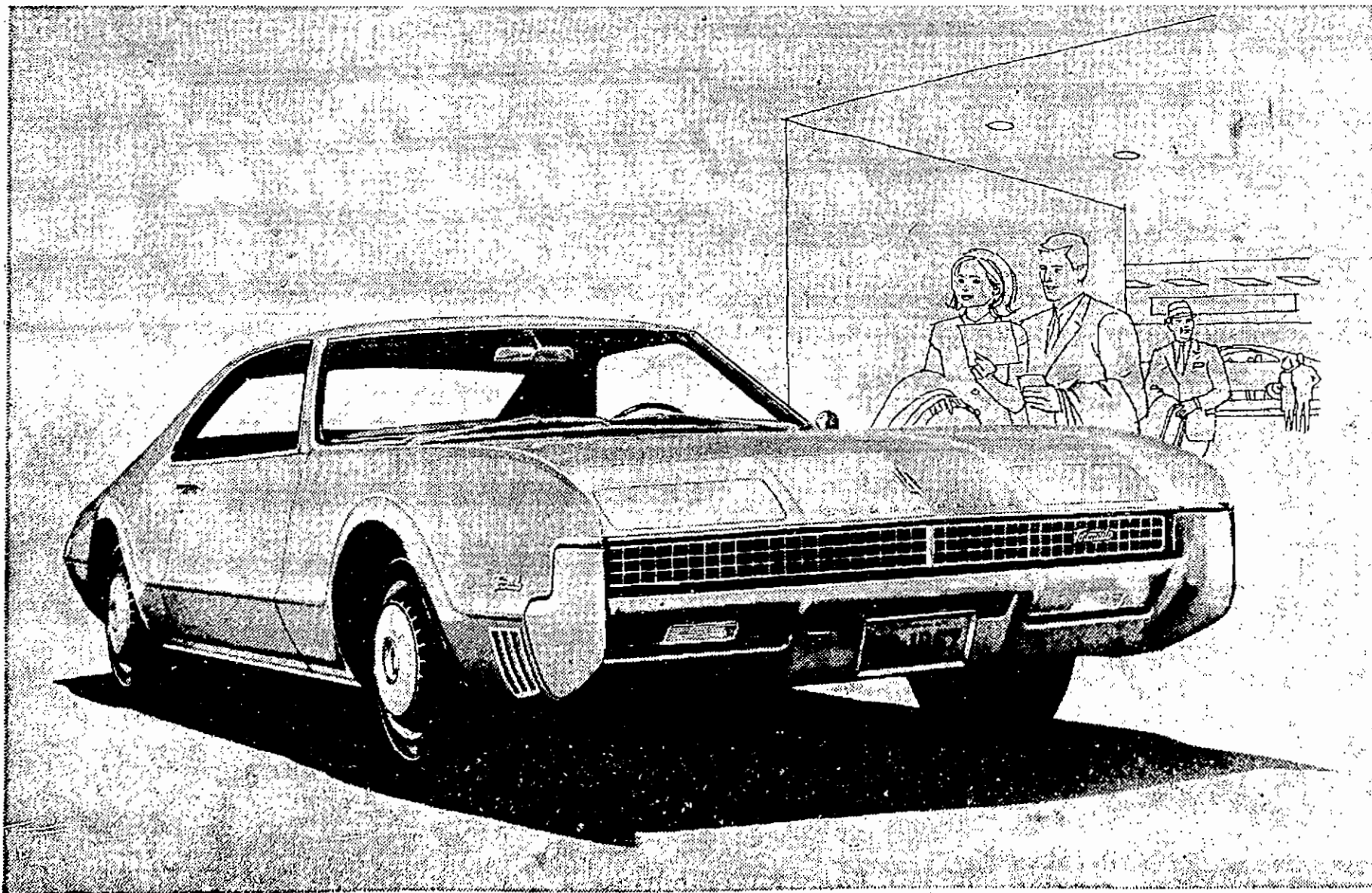

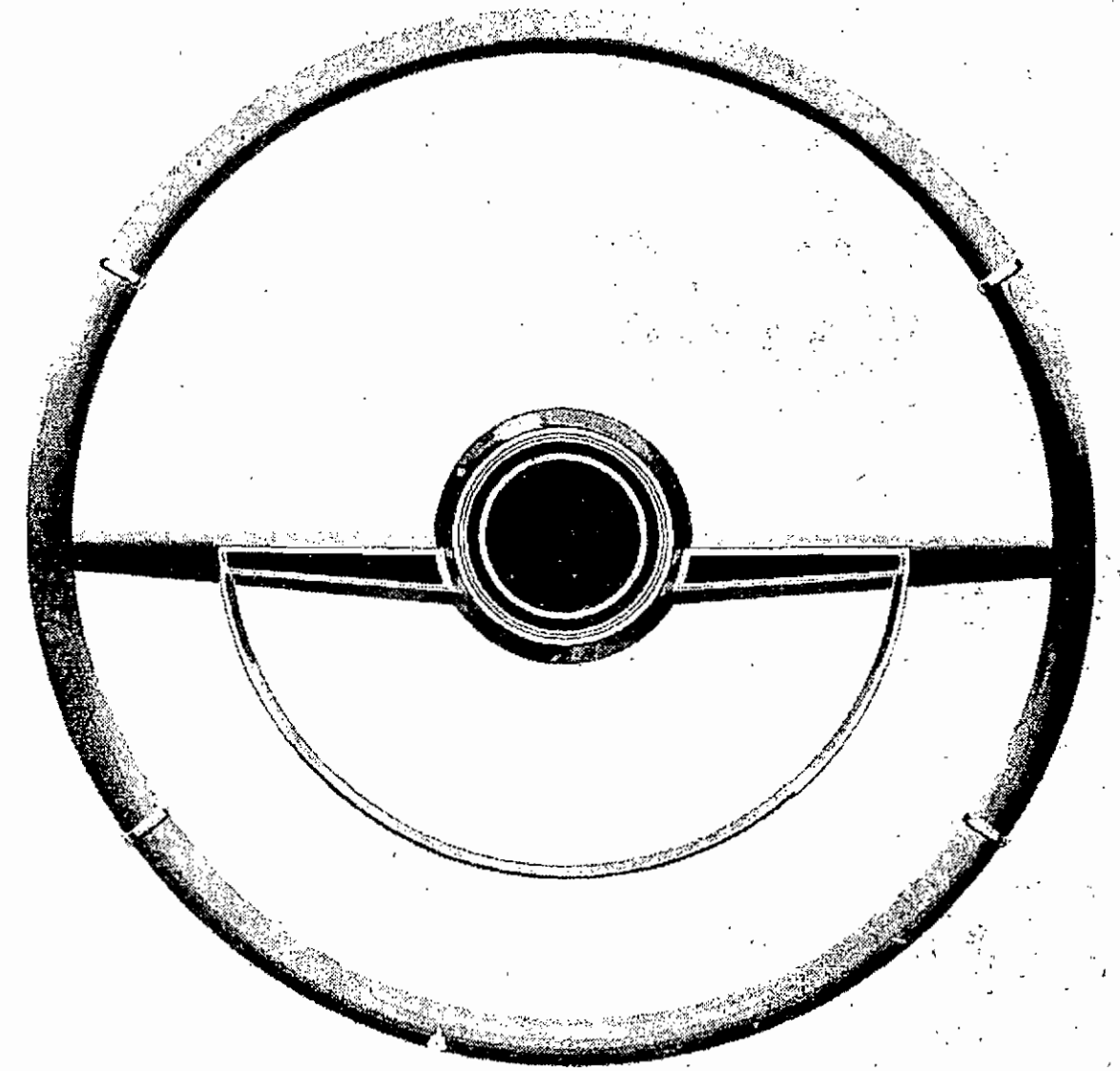
